## ABOUT YOUR JUDGES

### ***Dogs: Mr Gerald Condron*** (Covarney)

I started in 1975 with Woodmarsh Beau Nash (SH CH Stephenshill Gamebird x Bronrians Becky Of Woodmarsh). Primarily involved with obedience training and part of a clubs display team, but also competing at obedience tests at open shows. We were encouraged by the likes of Brian Clarke, John Baglow, Yvonne Vaughan and Willie and Lorna Carslake to also enter Beau in the conformation classes.

I started judging (the old fashioned way), firstly at matches and exemption shows. In 1988 (after 13 yrs) I judged Irish at my first open show, I remember Chris Amoo was also judging at this show. I first awarded CCs at WELKS 2002. Kate and myself were privileged and honoured to judge The World Show in Sweden 2008. For a number of years we were involved with the Breed rescue in the south west.

Now retired, I started working life as a production planner and have been a Police Officer (receiving a Chief Constables Commendation), Chemical Plant Operator and Papermakers Assistant. For over 25 years I was also a Stage 3 qualified youth worker. In my spare time I served as a committee member and then Chairman of a Co-ownership housing society.

In the role of Cup Steward for SEISC, I am particularly proud of tracking down trophies and cups that had been missing for a very long time. Repairing several as necessary and labelling and photographing them all. I also catalogued their historical artefacts. It saddened me that these precious historical items should be treated so disrespectfully, modern times I suppose.

To us every dog bred or owned has been significant, they may not have attained titles but have played a significant part in breeding programmes (were it not so, what would be the point in breeding/exhibiting?). Obviously there are the standout exhibits, starting with Beau, who taught us so much about obedience, showing and living with this wonderful breed. SH CH Loskeran Oleander JW and his younger sister Loskeran Moon Maiden, from where the Covarney breeding programme started. SH CH Cara Mia Mine at Teramour and SH CH Monello JW.

Other CC winning stock, Charity, Teak Me To The Top Via Stourford & Miss B'Havin, some overseas exported Champions and numerous Stud Book winners. We believe our record shows that we have been consistent in breeding Irish Setters of soundness and quality and these have also continued to produce quality in the lines of others. We refer to Flapjack and Chocolate Mousse as 'hidden assets' lying behind a lot of pedigrees. Apologies for any other names missed.

We recognise that it does take two to tango and thank all the stud dog owners and bitch owners who have used our dogs, for their help, support and collaboration.

Unfortunately over the last couple of years my other hobbies of sea swimming, surfing and body boarding have been curtailed by health issues and age. We do enjoy going out in our motorhome and camping out as often as possible.

### ***Bitches: Mrs Brenda Berry*** (Brinara)

I owned my first Irish Setter bought as a family pet in 1966. She came from Irish working lines; a pretty girl, lightly shown but never bred from. This was the start of my long relationship with the breed and dog showing.

Life became busier after I got married when I aquired my Brinara affix and also opted to enter the world of pedigree cats breeding and showing British Shorthairs under my Koenen affix. My husband and I were kept occupied with working on cat show and dog show committees.

Until my daughter's arrival, I followed a career in cataloguing antiquarian books. Arts and crafts always have been a hobby, and I particularly loved being involved with creative work in pottery and watercolour painting.

My first Irish Setter bitch bought to show was Sorrel, a lovely line-bred Hartsbourne bitch, from Mrs Viv King, Brenrue Moselle of Brinara, who became the foundation bitch of my small kennel. Her mating to Cornevon Starspangle in 1973 produced a special boy and my first Show Champion, Sh Ch Brinara Inula. He was influential on the breed, siring CC, RCC winners and Stud Book entrants. He sits behind the pedigrees of the dogs in some of today's well-known kennels at home and abroad, and of the dogs I have owned and bred in partnership with Lynn Morris, including Sh Ch Brinara Back Seat Driver and Sh Ch Brinara Vanity Fair JW.

After a long apprenticeship judging Irish Setters at Limit and Open shows, my first Championship appointment was for Bitches at LKA in 1984 where I awarded the CC to Fondador Charlene, who subsequently gained her title, and the RCC to Caspian's Aphodile. Since then I have been honoured to judge at Championship Shows including breed club shows across Britain and in Holland, Belgium and Germany. The highlight of these appointments has to be judging Dogs at Crufts in 2002, awarding the CC to Sh Ch Shenanigan Some Might Say It's Bardonhill JW and the RCC to Grayrigge Glenamoy JW.

Apart from showing, I have served on the Sutton Coldfield Canine Society committee and also assisted with their weekly ringcraft classes. I was a founder member of the Midland Irish Setter Society and served on the committee for many years, and was honoured to chair the club for a short period of time.

All our dogs are taken to dog training classes, and take part in the Kennel Club Good Citizen Scheme. At one point, I had 5 dogs with their gold awards.

I am honoured and delighted to be asked to judge at this year's ISAE Championship Show, and look forward to judging this most beautiful breed again.

### **Stakes Classes: Mr Hefin Jones**

Irish Setters have figured in my life for its entirety, I was born into a home where they played a significant part. I grew up with Wendover, Windrush and Kerryfair, to name but a few, our initial boys living to a great age of 17. One of my earliest photos is of me attempting to stack a very patient Irish, who was doing a better job standing than I was. Up until relatively recently, we only kept dogs. That changed when showing became more significant in my life. Currently, with my mother, I co-own Gwendariff and Kerryfair; 3 girls and 2 boys. Recently, one has become a Show Champion, another gained a JW and all successful in the ring. We have also been privileged to be the happy owners of a rescued Irish Setter dog.

Although only judging over the last 6 years, I have been very lucky and had some lovely dogs come under me. I have enjoyed each occasion and feel the excitement of the exhibitor when their Irish has gone on to be successful in the Group. I am always grateful to those who have brought their lovely dogs under me.

I am a committee member of the Irish Setter Club of Wales, the Health Officer, member of the judging and seminar sub-committee and assist with the technology. I am also on the Committees of Gundog Society of Wales and Welsh Kennel Club.

Although passing my Viva some time ago, I have recently graduated with a Doctorate/PhD from Aberystwyth University in Veterinary and Animal Science, with specific interest in molecular biology and the role nutrition plays in maintaining the health of animals. My Masters and Undergraduate were also in the same field.

At present, I work for Vethub1 that is geared towards research in the field of animal diseases and also cryopreservation, which in time will address heritable diseases, predominantly in dogs.

Dogs became even more prominent in my life after having to retire from playing age limited championship rugby. Although this is still a massive interest to me as a proud Welshman, showing dogs took over. I have been a member of the British Koi Keepers Society and with my interest in animal health, I was on the health committee for several years. This interest has led me to Japan on several occasions. I also rear wildfowl - ducks and geese, for conservation programs.

# RULES & REGULATIONS

*(This is a Championship Show confined to Irish Setters (Red) and open to all exhibitors)*

**No other breed of dog will be allowed within the precincts of the show** except those permitted by Regulation F(1) 3.55/11

1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees: Members £18.00 first entry per dog; £2.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog; Non Members £24.00 first entry per dog; £3.00 each subsequent entry with the same dog. Not For Competition: £3.00 per dog. Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries (limited number available on the day at £4.00). Membership: UK – Single £11.00; Joint £12.00; Overseas – Single/Joint £15.00.
6. There is no prize money on offer at this Show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show**  
Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **Best in Show**  
Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. All dogs must be brought with a suitable chain and a collar properly fastened to the dog.
21. All exhibits must be accompanied. The Committee cannot undertake to accept or despatch unaccompanied dogs.
22. Should any of the judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint a substitute. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entrance fee can be refunded.
23. Each Judge will be instructed and empowered to withhold any prize in any class, if of the opinion that the dog does not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the Schedule. A Judges decision shall be final except in a case of fraud, or misrepresentation or where a mistake has been made bona fide by the Judge.
24. An announcement prior to closing of entries in 'Our Dogs' of any alterations or additions made by the Committee to the Schedule or to these Regulations, shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.
25. Parents will be held responsible for the actions and any damage caused by their children within the environs of the show.
26. The Owner, Exhibitor, Handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club Licensed events, must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
27. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Anyone failing to clear up will be reported to the Committee who may enforce the right to refuse entries from that exhibitor for future shows.
28. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to them, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of or damage to any dog or person from any cause whatsoever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, Servants, agents or others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
29. The Officers & Committee of the Irish Setter Association, England cannot accept responsibility for any products advertised or sold by stall holders and/or trade stands at this Show. Exhibitors are reminded that products on sale for the preparation and grooming of dogs may not meet the requirements of the Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F(B).
30. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.

31. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
  32. The Association reserves to itself the right to refuse entries and all dishonoured cheques will be charged at £10 for subsequent presentations.

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

*(The word "dog" includes both sexes)*

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday, 27th August 2022**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1)19.

(2) *Transfer*

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer It to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**JUNIOR** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**YEARLING** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**NOVICE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**UNDERGRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Championship Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**MID LIMIT** For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT** For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

**FIELD TRIAL** For dogs which have won prizes, Diplomas of Merit or Certificates of Merit in actual competition at a Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Regulations.

**BRACE** For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

**SPECIAL BEGINNERS** For dogs owned and handled by exhibitor neither Dog or exhibitor to have won a CC in the Breed. **Both dog and exhibitor to qualify.**

**SPECIAL FIELD TRIAL** For For dogs which have been entered and have run in any licensed Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Rules and Regulations.

**SPECIAL PROGENY** For a dog or bitch, accompanied by at least three and not more than six of its registered progeny. The dog or bitch not necessarily entered in another class however, all progeny having been entered and exhibited in another class. The dog or bitch and the progeny need not be registered in the same ownership. **See proviso to Regulation 12.**

**THE CHRISTINE HERON MEMORIAL JUNIOR STAKES** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**THE GEOFF COUPE MEMORIAL POST GRADUATE STAKES** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**THE PAT RHODES MEMORIAL OPEN STAKES** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

### **ADVISORY NOTICE**

**NOT FOR COMPETITION** Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.
